#### How will I check my grade for Enr. Language Arts?

I can check my progress/grades by accessing PowerSchool from any electronic device, with permission, at school. Or, I can check my progress at my convenience via PowerSchool App or computer.

#### What do I do if I am absent?

Always check the 8Red Weebly website at hms8red.weebly.com for homework, handouts, and assignment due dates. A student has one extra day to turn in any work **assigned** on a day a student was absent (excused). If a quiz was administered on a day a student was absent, the quiz must be made up on the **first** day the student returns. If previously assigned work was due on the day of the absence, the work is due on the **first** day the student returns otherwise it is considered late and will only receive 50%. If not received within a week, then a zero will be earned. Second semester there is NO LATE WORK accepted in ELA. NRI and AR no late submissions accepted.

#### Do I have to read outside class?

YES! Some outside reading will be assigned

stories/novels/poems/plays we are reading as a class, however, most of your silent reading will be outside class. Library day will be every other Wednesday. All students will be expected to read independently on a daily basis. Students must bring a reading book to school so they are prepared for any independent reading during Enriched Language Arts and ELP. AR is10% of your ELA grade. ELA students will also be required to read 3 Rebecca Caudill books.

#### What types of writing will I do this year?

**Formal Papers** refer to essays/papers that students will complete in their Google Classroom. Even though these papers will be worked on and stored in the student's Google Drive, the completed piece must be turned in to the teacher on the **DUE DATE** listed on Google Classroom.

#### What are the required readings this year?

"Flowers for Algernon" / "The Dinner Party" / "Paul Revere's Ride"/ "The Tell-Tale Heart" / "The Bet" / "Harriet Tubman" / "O Captain, My Captain" / "I Have a Dream" / "New Day's Lyric"/ The Diary of Anne Frank / Assorted poems and stories not listed / To Kill a Mockingbird / podcasts, if time How is ELA different from LA? Enrichment means this...the class may be at an accelerated pace, at a greater depth, and a wider range of topics. Unit topics will be similar to LA first semester (short stories, poetry, *The Diary of Anne Frank* and the Holocaust; however, homework, discussions, papers, projects, etc. may be different. There will be more independent work. There will be more discussion. The goal is to dig deeper and gain insight.

Fourth quarter we will read the novel *To Kill a Mockingbird*. We will also be writing penpal letters to Mrs. Grigg's kindergarteners at Alhambra Primary throughout the year. More information to follow.
